





OVERALL IMPRESSIONS AND GENERAL RECAP COACHES WEEK JANUARY 2024 PRESENTED BY TYLER WAGNER

- It was remarkable to experience both the culture that exists within Whitehorse Minor Hockey, as well as the amazing people who drive the association forward. Everyone we interacted with were kind, thoughtful, engaged and passionate. In addition, it's obvious that all these fantastic human qualities are taught to the young players just through the act of modelling by the leaders in your community. In Calgary and in other big centres around Canada, we struggle with a lack of genuine joy for the game of hockey because most families are on the fast track of getting somewhere more important.
- There was not once where we felt this type of fixed mindset approach in your association as every player we encountered had a huge smile on their face, and the coaches on the ice were engaged, willing to learn, and had no ego attached to their craft. From an individual skills perspective, we felt that all your hockey players were right where they all should be based on your age groups. It's an amazing thing to see the best player in an age group be on the same ice with someone their age just learning to skate, and yet everyone has a smile on their face and they're improving based on their genuine love of the game!

• Although you might think this is common practice, it's not. In city centres with multiple division levels at each age group, it can become unhealthy from a competitive drive standpoint for both the parents and the player, leading to an enormous amount of pressure, even starting in U9 when players are first tiered. You should be very thankful that your association avoided this culture as it leads to burnout, a lack of genuine love of the game, living life with a fixed mindset, and most importantly, early exits for kids out of hockey.
